The intellectual author gives the order; the material author brings the message. Their advisers say 'Look, so-and-so is talking too much.'

They caught me off guard. They said 'A bullet costs 2,000 pesos.' They send flowers in the post as sympathy. It's a hint, not very subtle.

I am from a *campesino* family, we have seen many killed. Accused of links to the left, collaborating with guerrillas. It has all been an excuse to take our land.

Along the Caribbean, the violence has been systematic, generalised political.

The attacks,

You ask yourself:
should I denounce this?
How you can report crimes
when there is this sort of corruption?
I can't speak
openly; the co-optation of the word.

I don't work the land any more but I will always have a *campesino* identity.
